In keeping with our focus on environmental stewardship, Canyon Creek Cabinet Company's products are in compliance with the California Air Resources Board (CARB) requirements which took effect January 1, 2009.

With the creation of its comprehensive CARB program, California has set one of the toughest standards in the world for placing limits on formaldehyde emissions in products. CARB requirements will be phased in over a three-year time frame, with full compliance (Phase II) achieved by January 1, 2012.

In order to comply with the new rules, cabinet manufacturers will need to prove that their products—both foreign and domestic—are made from compliant materials through "chain of custody" third-party documentation from their suppliers.

All cabinets shipped to California follow the CARB guidelines, and Canyon Creek offers CARB-compliant products throughout its distribution area.

In addition to requirements of CARB, Canyon Creek is working towards providing you with No Added Urea Formaldehyde (NAUF) cabinetry. Our conversion varnish finish has one of the lowest urea formaldehyde content levels in the cabinet industry and all our adhesives have NAUF. In the near future, we also plan to add panels that are manufactured with NAUF and more sustainable wood species so that you can offer your customers the "green" cabinetry they've been asking for.

As the first cabinet company to be presented with the KCMA's Environmental Stewardship Program (ESP) certificate, Canyon Creek continues to demonstrate its commitment to environmental stewardship through its actions, products and programs. By systematically adopting the requirements set forth by CARB, Canyon Creek has reinforced its reputation of being forward-thinking and the environmental leader in the cabinet industry.
